Safeguarding Policy

This policy applies to all staff, coaches and volunteers working on behalf of Kaizen Academy.

The purpose of this policy:

- Protect children and young people who receive training at Kaizen Academy, and any children of adults who may train at Kaizen Academy.
- Provide staff and volunteers with a framework to guide them in safeguarding children.
- Provide a reference to any parents who may have children who train or would consider training at Kaizen academy.

Kaizen Academy believe that a child should never experience abuse of any kind, and thus we have a responsibility to promote the welfare of all children and young people. We are committed to training and practice in a way that protects them.
